Daniel Thomson was born and raised in Orange County and grew up in Huntington Beach studying piano, guitar, and trumpet. He completed his Bachelor of Arts and teaching credential at UCLA. While there, he was a member of the UCLA Marching Band for four years and was drum major his Sophomore, Junior, and Senior year. Mr. Thomson also spent five summers touring with drum and bugle corps; first with Impulse in 2002 and 2003, and then with the Concord Blue Devils in 2004, 2005, and 2006. As a marching tech, Mr. Thomson worked with Westlake High School, Logan High School, and spent two summers as the Visual Caption Head for the Blue Devils "B" corps. He eventually settled in the Bay Area, directing music at Terra Linda High School for the past 15 years. There, he taught wind ensemble, orchestra, jazz band, piano, guitar, choir, drumline, digital music production, and pit ensembles for Spring musicals. Mr. Thomson has conducted Fiddler on the Roof, Anything Goes, West Side Story, Drowsy Chaperone, Little Mermaid, Chicago, Little Shop of Horrors, Rock of Ages, and Addams Family. PROGRAM DONATION

Regardless of what program your student participates in, there are costs that must be covered. The Boosters do everything possible to keep costs at a minimum and reduce your out-of-pocket expenses. All collected funds go towards running the MVHS Instrumental Music Program. Please review the Program Donation schedule. PROGRAM POLICIES

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Mission Viejo Instrumental Music Program holds in place high standards in order to ensure its highest success and the safety of all participants. To participate in the program, students and parents are required to sign and return an acknowledgement that they have read and agree with the Code of Conduct Action & Consequences, and Early Dismissal Policy.

A student's decision to become a member of the MVHS Instrumental Music Program involves certain responsibilities and obligations, as listed below. If there are any questions about this policy, please do not hesitate to ask the Director. The Code of Conduct lists a set of mandatory requirements for our organization, which include expected behavioral guidelines for performing, rehearsing, or traveling with the Mission Viejo High School Instrumental Music Program.

- 1. Behavior by a member of the instrumental music program that brings discredit or embarrassment to themselves or the organization is unacceptable. Conduct that falls into this category includes, but is not limited to:
 - Fighting with or harassing students
 - Damaging public, school or personal property
 - Stealing
 - Using profanity
 - Use of alcohol, tobacco and/or illegal drugs at any time
 - Public displays of affection
 - Speaking negatively of other programs, in or out of MVHS
 - **Note**: It is expected that the behavior described above will be avoided on and off the MVHS campus.
- 2. All booster parents and volunteers are to be treated with respect, and their requests are to be obeyed by all students without exception.
- 3. When participating in a festival, parade, half-time competition, or any other contest, respect to all other groups must be shown.
- 4. Failure to attend a performance will result in a lowered grade (see grading policy). If you have a conflict with a rehearsal or performance, contact the Director as soon as possible prior to the event.
- 5. A proper attitude toward school is required of all program members.. Multiple and repeated infractions will incur a parent-teacher conference regarding the eligibility of the student in the program.
 - Excessive and/ or unexcused absences will result in a lowered grade (see grading policy).
 - Don't be late. Tardiness will result in a lower semester grade (see grading policy)
 - Be respectful at all times, to all people. That means teachers, parents, students, competitive groups, and the general public.
 - Do not schedule appointments during rehearsal hours. If there is an issue, contact the director.
- 6. Take proper care of uniforms and instruments:
 - No eating or drinking (except water) in uniform.
 - Wear the designated undergarments under your uniform.
 - Hang up your uniform correctly.
 - Do not take your uniform home.
 - Take care when using any school issued instrument. You will be financially responsible for any damage or loss.

- 7. Dress code will be followed for all events for all performance groups. The Instrumental Music Program represents the entire school when performing and all involved are to be neatly and uniformly dressed.
 - Marching Band:
 - o Provided: Uniform jacket, bibs/pants, bling, gloves, gauntlets, shaiko
 - Purchased by student: shoes, dri-fit shirt, compression shorts, socks
 - Color Guard:
 - o Purchased by students, varies by season
 - Drumline
 - Fall: same as Marching Band (see above)
 - Spring: Purchased by students, varies by season
 - Concert Ensembles (including Orchestra, Wind Ensemble, and Jazz Band; rented/purchased by students)
 - Young men: black tuxedos with white shirts and bow ties with black dress shoes (no tennis/athletic shoes).
 - Young ladies: long black dress, black pant-suit or tuxedo. Skirts at a minimum must cover knees when seated. No low cut tops. Sleeves should cover the shoulders and upper arms. Black tights/nylons must be worn, if legs are exposed. Black dress shoes (no tennis/athletic shoes).
 - **Specific uniform requirements and needs and suggested retailers can be discussed with the Uniform Manager**
- 8. Instrumental music students must buy an ASB card as we receive funds from ASB to help support our activities throughout the year.
- 9. It must be understood that violations of the instrumental music code may be sufficient cause for removal from the music program. Complete authority in this matter lies directly with the band director and the principal of the school, whose decision is final and binding.

EARLY DISMISSAL POLICY

Leaving early or arriving late to any performance are strongly discouraged. However, under extenuating circumstances, school and district policy state:

- 1. Students wishing to leave an organized music group activity (e.g., performance or festival) prior to the group dismissal must bring a note from his/her parent to the appropriate manager for the event at least one week prior to the event. The note should explain the reason for early dismissal.
- 2. The student assumes responsibility for making sure that his/her equipment and uniform are properly hung and placed where it can be stored with the other students' after general dismissal.
- 3. The student will be dismissed only to his/her parent, or an adult (21 years or older), authorized in writing by his/her parents. The student will not be dismissed to an unauthorized person.
- 4. The student must also bring a completed SVUSD Transportation Exemption Form (see **FORMS** section) at least 48 hours before any event for which District transportation (i.e. buses) have been provided.

GRADING POLICY FOR ALL MUSIC GROUPS

Violations of the band code may be sufficient cause for removal from the organization. Complete authority in this matter lies directly with the band director, the dean of students, and the SVUSD Board of Education, whose decision is final and binding. Each member in a performing organization reinforces and strengthens the other members of the group. Each person's contribution is extremely important. Whenever someone is absent from a rehearsal or performance, the loss to the group is more than just the individual and is detrimental to the entire group. Learning the music, drill, equipment work, and group precision cannot be made up outside of class.

Therefore, attendance during class time and for all rehearsals is extremely important. The grading policy leans heavily toward attendance, participation, and improvement. Your grades will be determined by:

- 1. 60% participation and attendance
 - a. All rehearsals and performances
 - b. Sectionals
 - c. Tardies unexcused absences and truancies affect a large portion of the grade and will not be tolerated
 - d. Behavior proper behavior at all times as defined by the Code of Conduct
 - e. Always having proper equipment
- 2. 30% Classroom assignments
 - a. Recorded performances to be uploaded to Google classroom
 - b. Written concert reflections
- 3. 10% Ability to perform individual part of the performance

BUS BEHAVIOR RULES

When traveling to or from MVHS instrumental events by bus, the following rules apply:

- 1. SILENT bus when leaving and arriving parking lots and while on surface streets. Talking is allowed when the bus is on the freeway.
- 2. Do not change seats while the bus is in motion, unless authorized by the parent chaperone.
- 3. No public displays of affection. Holding hands is permitted.
- 4. No propellants (hairspray, etc) or anything that will broadcast a scent.
- 5. Show proper respect to chaperones, drivers, and all student leaders at all times.
- 6. Pick up all trash when the trip is over BEFORE getting off the bus.
- 7. Students are responsible to help load and unload instruments, props, etc., into and out of the truck or trailers.
